

#### Fourth Sunday of Advent



Over the past two Sundays the Gospel readings have introduced us to John the Baptist as the herald chosen "to prepare the way" of the messiah. On this Fourth Sunday, we meet Joseph, the husband of Mary. In Matthew's Gospel it is Joseph who is told of Jesus's conception and Jesus' role as the messiah whereas in the Gospel of Luke, it is Mary who is told the news in the Annunciation story. When Joseph found out that his fiancé Mary was already pregnant before they came to live together, according to Mosaic Law the only option he had was to divorce Mary. But, an angel appeared to Joseph in a dream and revealed the identity of the baby Mary was carrying. And so, Joseph did exactly what the angel told him to do-that he should not be afraid to take Mary as his wife. Have we wondered what made Joseph be obedient to God and to put his trust in God at that particular challenging moment of his life? What can we learn from Joseph? As part of our spiritual preparation to celebrate Christmas in a few days' time, Joseph can be a model for us as people of faith. We are invited to learn to develop an attitude to that of Joseph who surrendered himself to God. As things become fast paced and there is so much to do before Christmas, we are encouraged to learn to become more and more trusting and obedient to God and to open our hearts to the working of the Spirit. When we strive to follow in the footsteps of Joseph, we may learn to become more loving in our relationships with God and with one another. This is the spirit of the celebration of Christmas--God is with us. Fr. Yaw

#### Holy Day of Obligation

A Holy Day of Obligation is a day on which the faithful are expected to attend Mass and to engage in rest from work and recreation in accordance with the Third Commandment. In Canada, the Canadian Council of Catholic Bishops has decreed that the Holy Days of Obligation to be observed are all Sundays of the Liturgical Year, Christmas Day and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God on New Year's Day. The celebrations of the Solemnities of Epiphany, the Ascension of the Lord, the Holy Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*) are transferred to the following Sunday.
