THE SEASON OF LENT

On Ash Wednesday (Feb. 26) we begin a new journey of faith-a journey of spiritual renewal when we focus on the Passion of Christ and his death on the Cross. Jesus' death on the cross speaks to us about God's love and mercy for his people. Jesus calls us who believe in him to take up our cross and follow him. To live out the Christian faith therefore means to embrace the cross as a way of life. What does it mean to embrace the cross? This year, let us focus on how we as disciples can truly embrace the cross. Learning to embrace the cross may help us develop a positive attitude to change from our former ways to becoming spiritually closer to God. To embrace the cross does not call us to do what we might consider great and extraordinary things. In fact, as shown by the lives of the saints, to embrace the cross means committing ourselves to doing what is pleasing in the sight of God. This calls us to make sacrifices in our lives for the sake of others. According to Pope Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, (The Joy of the Gospel): "When we stand before Jesus crucified, we see the depth of his love which exalts and sustains us, but at the same time unless we are blind, we begin to realize that Jesus' gaze, burning with love, expands to embrace all his people." (268). When we genuinely open ourselves with contrite hearts to be transformed by the Spirit of love of Christ, we learn how to carry our own cross so that the love of Christ is real and present in our communities.
