#### Two Processions, One Heart

Today is Palm Sunday, and the liturgy invites us to witness two processions. The first takes place as Jesus enters the city of Jerusalem, and the second unfolds as He is led outside the city walls. At first glance, these processions seem to stand in stark contrast. One is marked by triumph and joy—the other by sorrow and scorn.

Yet, despite their differences, both processions center around the same figure: Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, today, and forever. He enters Jerusalem as a triumphant king, hailed with palm branches and cries of "Hosanna!" And He departs as a condemned prisoner, burdened by a cross, surrounded by mockery and rejection. Still, He is unchanged—steadfast and obedient, journeying to the cross to conquer sin and death, to capture our hearts for the Father, and to lead us, ultimately, to the joy of eternal life.

While Christ remains constant, the crowd around Him does not. And that crowd is, in many ways, a reflection of us. Like the people in the Gospel, we are often changeable. We cheer when the moment is glorious and easy, and we jeer when the path grows difficult. Our hearts, too, can be divided—drawn at times toward God, yet easily swayed by fear, pride, or indifference.

Christ's invitation to us, especially in this sacred season, is to be single-hearted—to belong entirely to Him. Lent, with its traditional practices of penance, is a time for this transformation. It offers us the chance to shed the double heart, to become people who no longer shift with the crowd but stand firm in love.

Prayer calls us to love God with our whole heart, soul, and mind. Fasting teaches us to govern ourselves wisely, loving ourselves in a way that is life-giving rather than self-indulgent. Almsgiving leads us to love our neighbor as ourselves, sharing our blessings with those in need.

These Lenten disciplines purify our hearts, training us in love, that we may recognize which procession we are truly a part of. And so the question confronts us: When Christ passes by, which side are we on? Do we cheer Him as King or turn away when the cross becomes visible?

But even this is not the final question. Christ does not simply ask us to choose between cheering and jeering, between following or abandoning. He invites us to something deeper: to walk with Him. Like Simon of Cyrene, we are called to take up the cross—not just to watch the procession, but to become part of it. Not merely to avoid the mob, but to become like Christ.

Our Lenten journey leads us to Easter-the great celebration of resurrection and baptism. On that
