The Mark of Christian Identity: Love

The readings for this weekend are deeply encouraging, reminding us that God is not a distant figure, but a God who is with His people—Emmanuel, "God with us." Our God is with us, walking beside us, and constantly at work, taking away our pain and tears. He is actively bringing healing and peace into the hearts of His beloved people. This is the nature of our God: present, compassionate, and deeply involved in the lives of His followers.

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers His final instructions to His disciples before His suffering and death. When someone knows their time is short, when the hour of their departure is imminent, their deepest values and desires come to the forefront. What Jesus said and did in those final moments reveals what is truly important to God, and what He wants us to focus on in our own lives.

It's crucial to notice what Jesus did not say at this pivotal moment. He did not say, "Above all else, even if you're not living out the Gospel, at least make sure you look the part." He certainly didn't say, "Remember this if you remember nothing else: keeping up appearances and following the letter of the law is the most important thing." And He most definitely didn't say, "Disassociate yourself from everyone who stumbles or falls short."

What Jesus did say is powerful: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this, all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

The message is clear. Love is what matters above all else. Love and compassion are at the heart of what it means to follow Christ. Keeping God's law and doing good are not unimportant, but they must be done with the love of God in our hearts, flowing outward into actions motivated by that love. If we miss the love, we miss everything.

Before He suffered and died, Jesus wanted to make this abundantly clear: "People will know you are my disciples by the way you love one another." This is the defining characteristic of a Christian—love. When others see the quality of our love, mercy, compassion, and care, they are inspired and moved. But when they don't see it, they can be discouraged, even scandalized, and may lose trust, hope, and faith.

To illustrate this, consider the story of the renowned French artist Paul Gustave Doré. While traveling in Europe, Doré lost his passport. At a border crossing, he explained his situation to a guard, hoping to be recognized and allowed to pass. The guard, however, was skeptical, saying that many people try to cross the border by claiming to be someone they're not. Doré insisted on his identity, and the guard proposed a test. He handed Doré a pencil and a piece of paper and asked him to sketch some peasants nearby. Doré, with incredible skill, completed the sketch in no time, and the guard, convinced of his identity, allowed him to pass. Doré's actions confirmed who he was. In the same way, Jesus tells us that our love for one another is the test that confirms our identity as His disciples. "By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Love is the Christian's identity. It's not just a feeling or an abstract concept; it is our uniform, our habit, our way of life. If we wear the habit of love, we are in—we belong to Christ. If we do not wear love as a habit, we are out. True Christian love is a love that seeks the best for others, even at the cost of our own desires and ambitions. It is a love that serves, sacrifices, suffers, and puts others first.

This is the love that Jesus wanted His disciples to carry with them after His death. It is the love that identifies us as Christians—the love that moves us to action, to give of ourselves for the good of others. This is how the world will know we are Christians: by the depth, quality, and practicality of our love. They will know we are Christians by our love.

So, let us be inspired and convicted by this call to love. Let us wear the mark of Christian identity, not in outward appearances, but in the genuine, self-giving love we offer to others. In doing so, we reflect the love that Jesus has shown us, and we become the living testimony of His presence in the world.


