FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT VEILING OF CROSSES AND IMAGES

The Fifth Sunday of Lent marks the beginning of the last phase of Lent, traditionally known as Passiontide. Crosses and images in the church are veiled before the Vigil Mass of the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The Stations of the Cross and images in stained-glass windows are never veiled. The colour of the veils is purple. Crosses remain covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday. All other images are unveiled just before the celebration of Easter Vigil. This tradition of covering of crosses and images helps us to concentrate on "the great essentials of Christ's work of Redemption". From Ceremonies of the Liturgical Year

PALM SUNDAY

Palm Sunday ushers us into a special week in the Church's liturgical calendar referred to as Holy Week. On Palm Sunday we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and also his Passion and death. Whereas Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem exhibited an atmosphere of victory, joy and hope, an atmosphere of hostility and hopelessness is displayed in the Passion narrative. However, the two events cannot be separated from each other. The celebration of the triumphant entry and that of the suffering and death of Jesus are both significant to the celebration of Palm Sunday. Both events speak to us about the identity of Jesus and his mission. They speak to us about the Son of God, a king whose mission was accomplished at his death on the cross.

EASTER TRIDUUM

At the summit of the Church year, the three great days of the Easter Triduum encompass the Paschal Mystery and draw us into the Passion, death and Resurrection of Jesus our Saviour. With his disciples, we enter the upper room to celebrate the Passover (Holy Thursday). We accompany him to watch at his agony in Gethsemane, and then we follow him through the halls of judgment to his bitter Passion. We take his way of sorrow that leads to Calvary and death on a cross (Good Friday). Then we assist at his burial in the rock tomb. We wait in solemn vigil until he rises again, in our human flesh, glorious and immortal (Easter Vigil). So we look in hope to our compassionate High Priest returning to the Father and taking us to glory with him in his Mystical Body, the Church. From Ceremonies of the Liturgical Year
