What Is A Parish For?

According to Canon Law, a parish is described as a certain community of Christ's faithful stably established within a particular Church, whose pastoral care, under the authority of the diocesan Bishop, is entrusted to a parish priest as its proper pastor. As a general rule, a parish is to be territorial, that is, it is to embrace all Christ's faithful of a given territory. For practical purposes and for the celebration of the sacraments, Christ's faithful who do not live within the territorial boundaries of a parish but are formally registered in the particular parish are considered parishioners of the particular parish. There may also be establishment of certain parishes determined by reason of the rite, language or nationality of the faithful of a certain territory, or on some other basis, for example Our Lady of the Good Health Tamil parish in Toronto. According to Canon Law, parishes are primarily for the benefit of the faithful. The Church's mission in every parish is to be taken by all the faithful-the people of God, each playing their own part. When parishioners come together to use their gifts of time, talent and treasure as missionary disciples, they take their share of responsibility for the management of the parish. When parishioners live out their baptismal promises as faithful stewards, they build welcoming parishes full of life where everybody can grow spiritually closer to Jesus Christ and to each other. Fr.
