

THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY Friday, December 30, 2022

According to the liturgical calendar, the Sunday after Christmas Day is celebrated as the Feast of the Holy Family. This year because Christmas occurs on Sunday, the Feast of the Holy Family is celebrated on Friday, December 30. On this Feast day, we celebrate that Jesus was born into a human family-- the basic unit of society-- with Mary and Joseph, his parents.

When we talk about the Holy Family, we may have the tendency to think that the Holy Family was entirely different from any other family including our own families.
