PENTECOST SUNDAY-MAY 28, 2023

Pentecost: Receiving the fire of the Holy Spirit

Our journey through the Easter Season brings us to Pentecost Sunday. Today the Church celebrates an amazing gift, God's gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church. The three readings (Acts 2: 1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13; Gospel of John 20: 19-23) describe the events that took place on Pentecost and the effects of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the first disciples. Today's celebration means that the Church is a Church that speaks all languages; the Church is a Church for all peoples in the world. The Bible and the Church teach that the Holy Spirit is associated with baptism. By virtue of our baptism we are temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19). So, how would we describe our experiences of the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives? Today's celebration reminds us that the Holy Spirit came with different gifts. As baptized people, we are invited to examine the ways in which we can use the gifts of the Holy Spirit to serve. It is how we use the gifts of the Holy Spirit that will identify us as people endowed with the Holy Spirit. Our spiritual gifts come in many forms: the gifts help us lead our children as Christian parents, the gifts help us serve as catechists, listen to others, visit the sick and reach out to the needy. We use our gifts to serve others. Our service can be a way in which we can experience the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Our service to others can be a way of seeing the Holy Spirit active in our communities. Every kind of gift is essential in building up our communities of faith. We use our gifts to the glory of God. Today, let us turn to God to keep the fire of the Holy Spirit burning within our hearts. Let us ask him to teach us how to use our gifts to build our communities united in one Spirit and in one
