#### <u>The Joy of Service</u> <u>Stewards Make Our Parish</u>

"Our parishes are spiritual homes for the faithful where we meet one another to encounter Christ...Each of us needs to be Fully engaged as a disciple of Jesus, grateful For what we have received from God, and eager to share it creatively and responsibly. This is the spirit of deep stewardship" (Archdiocese of Toronto Pastoral Plan)

As baptized people, we are called to share God's gifts of time, talent and treasure to live out our baptismal promises as followers of Christ. Please see the two white binders at the back of the church for the description of the various ministries at Our Lady of Peace Parish.

#### DO YOU KNOW THAT .....?

The days throughout the Liturgical Year are given varying ranks of observance. Sunday is the first day of the liturgical week. It is the primordial Christian feast, the weekly paschal celebration observed by the Universal Church according to apostolic tradition. The Creed is said or sung at Mass on all Sundays and the Gloria is said or sung on Sundays except on Sundays in Advent and Lent.

Solemnities are regarded as the most important days in the liturgical calendar. They celebrate a mystery of faith, the life of Jesus, his mother and the lives of some saints. Examples of Solemnities are Christmas Day, The Annunciation of the Lord, St. Joseph--the Husband of Mary and All Saints Day. In some situations, the celebration of Sunday gives way to the celebration of Solemnities or Feasts of the Lord. In other situations, the celebration of Solemnities or Feasts of the Lord that falls on Sunday is observed on another day. The Gloria and the Creed are said or sung on Solemnities. Some Solemnities also have their own Vigil Mass celebrated on the evening before the actual day of the celebration.

Feasts are lower in ranking to Solemnities. Feast days are confined only to the natural day. Examples of Feasts are the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and the Feast of the Canadian Martyrs (In Canada). The Gloria is said or sung at Mass on Feast Days. The Creed is omitted. When a Feast of the Lord occurs on a Sunday in the Seasons of Ordinary Time and Christmas, the Feast replaces the particular Sunday Mass, for example the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

Memorials are of lesser importance and they are either obligatory or optional. Memorials commemorate saints for example, the Memorial of Saint Marguerite Bourgeoys. The Gloria and the Creed are omitted at Mass on the celebration of Memorials. When two or more optional Memorials occur on the same day, only one is to be celebrated at Mass.

Ferial is a weekday on which there is no special celebration.
