Stewardship Weekend

In his homily on Stewardship Sunday, His Grace Most Reverend Francis Leo, Archbishop of Toronto begins by emphasizing the importance of fairness and justice in our lives but reminds us that applying these concepts to God's actions can be misguided, as God's ways are beyond human comprehension.

The central message revolves around the idea of stewardship, both as individuals and as a community of believers. His Grace asks us to reflect on whether our thoughts, convictions, and actions align with Christ's teachings. They urge us to put on the "mind of Christ" and emulate His selflessness and generosity in our daily lives.

The Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard from the Gospel is used as a teaching tool to highlight God's extraordinary generosity, which transcends human notions of fairness. Archbishop encourages us to widen our perspectives and avoid pettiness, acknowledging that God's thoughts and ways are far greater than our own.

The concept of stewardship is expanded upon, emphasizing that it goes beyond financial contributions to include sharing love, abilities, time, skillsets, faith, and experiences. The act of giving is celebrated as a means of receiving, echoing St. Francis of Assisi's wisdom.

The homily delves into the various gifts bestowed upon individuals through Baptism and Confirmation, including theological virtues, gifts of the Holy Spirit, and charisms. Charisms are presented as special abilities given for the service of others, meant to empower us to be witnesses of God's grace and love. The importance of discerning and utilizing these gifts is stressed.

The role of the Church in coordinating and unifying these gifts is mentioned,

highlighting the duty of ordained members in this regard. Archbishop calls for a focus on magnanimity, which involves recognizing and utilizing one's God-given gifts to strive for excellence.

Stewardship is a way to evangelize and spread the Gospel, and it calls for the identification and encouragement of charisms within parish communities. The transformative power of God's love is the greatest gift.

His Grace expresses gratitude for the community's efforts in furthering the Lord's Kingdom through generosity and encourages continuous mindfulness of God's gifts and their generous sharing. Mother Mary is a role model for her openness to the Holy Spirit's gifts and willingness to act on God's will.

Stewardship Sunday serves as a reminder to embrace a generous and selfless attitude in our lives, recognizing and utilizing the gifts God has bestowed upon us for the betterment of our community and the spread of God's love and grace.
