#### **God and Caesar**

Today's readings resonate with a powerful message that stirs the very core of our existence. They illuminate the profound connection between our obligations to God and our devotion to our beloved country. In these sacred texts, we find a path towards becoming exemplary citizens of both Earth and Heaven, demonstrating the harmonious coexistence of our earthly duties and our divine calling.

In the first reading, Isaiah, the revered prophet, beautifully foretells the magnificent way in which even the actions of great worldly rulers, like the Persian Emperor Cyrus, can unknowingly become part of God's grand plan for His chosen people. It reminds us of that God's divine purpose weaves through the fabric of history, and our earthly actions can find profound meaning when aligned with His divine will.

Today's Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 96) serves as a gentle reminder of the profound truth that when we prioritize God's kingdom, we all reap the rewards. It illustrates the idea that a society rooted in faith, justice, and compassion is a society that thrives and flourishes.

In the second reading, the words of Paul shine like a beacon of hope as he commends the faithful converts in Thessalonica for their unwavering commitment to God and to Christ. Their embodiment of the theological virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity, guided by the Holy Spirit, is a testament to the transformative power of devotion to God.

In the Gospel, Jesus masterfully navigates a tricky question about paying taxes to Caesar. His response, "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God," echoes through the ages, reminding us that our commitment to God should far surpass any earthly obligations. It beckons us to recognize that while we have responsibilities to our nation, they must be carried out with the same dedication and respect that we reserve for our Creator and Lord.

Our duty as citizens extends to contributing to the common good by honoring just laws and actively working for the welfare of all. We must be vigilant in holding our elected representatives accountable to maintain law, order, and justice in our land, without infringing upon the laws of God.

As for our devotion to God, we are called to give ourselves completely, dedicating more than just a portion of our lives. We should approach our Sunday obligations with generosity, while also seeking daily moments for prayer, worship, and the nurturing of our faith and moral values.

Moreover, our offerings to the Church, be they financial or in the form of our time and talents, serve as expressions of our gratitude to God. Every act of service in our community becomes an offering to God, a reflection of our commitment to give Him our entire being.

In the symphony of life, let us be the virtuosos of earthly citizenship and heavenly devotion. By embracing our obligations to both God and country with unwavering commitment and enthusiasm, we manifest the highest form of human excellence, one that inspires others and brings us ever closer to the divine.

#### **World Mission Sunday**

World Mission Sunday, an annual tradition established 1926 by Pope Pius XI, unites over one billion Catholics worldwide. In October, the universal Church comes together to reflect and pray for missions that span the globe. This day serves as an opportunity to acknowledge the profound importance of mission work, reminding us that we are all part of one global Church committed to continuing Christ's mission, irrespective of our unique circumstances.

The most potent tool for fulfilling this mission is living a genuinely Christian life—one filled with love, mercy, kindness, compassion, and forgiveness. Much like Mahatma Gandhi's "apostolate of the rose," we should let our lives radiate our faith and values, attracting others through our actions rather than just words.
