Servant Leadership

In the days of the Austrian emperors, a poignant tradition unfolded within the hallowed walls of Vienna's St. Stephen's Cathedral during their funerals. This ritual, a symbolic testament to the essence of humility and nobility, held a significant place in the proceedings. As the appointed official neared the imposing gates of the cathedral, they would often find them securely closed. To gain entry, a simple yet profound act was required – a knock on the door. At the sound of this knock, a priest within the sacred confines would inquire, "Who seeks entrance here?" The official would reply, "His apostolic majesty, the emperor!" Yet, the priest's response would be, "I don't know him." A second knock reverberated, accompanied by a similar question. This time, the official declared, "The highest emperor." But once again, the priest's response echoed, "I don't know him." Finally, a third and resolute knock rang out. The priest inquired once more, "Who is it?" This time, the official humbly responded, "A poor sinner, your brother, seeks admittance!" In that moment, the door was swung open, and the royal funeral could proceed. This time-honored tradition within the Cathedral of St. Stephen serves as a powerful reminder of the profound truth that humility, in the face of majesty, can open doors and unite us all as equals in the eyes of a higher calling.

The core theme of today's readings transcends time and culture, as it extends a resounding invitation and challenge: to embody humility, selflessness, diligence, commitment, and love through service to our community. The Gospel urges us to resist the allure of hypocrisy and the pursuit of status, just as it did for the early Church and continues to do for our own Church communities.

In the first reading, the prophet Malachi vehemently condemns the irresponsible, proud, and indolent priests of his era, highlighting the pitfalls of self-serving leadership. In the second reading, St. Paul exemplifies the ideal of servant within Christian leadership a community, emphasizing the importance of leading through service. The Gospel narrative further reinforces this message by casting judgment upon religious leaders


more concerned with self-promotion than the wellbeing of their community.

True leadership, in the spirit of Christ, demands unwavering integrity and honesty from those in positions of authority, whether they be priests, parents, teachers, or politicians. It calls for an end to double standards and instead nurtures a profound sense of equality and mutual respect between leaders and those they serve. This new community values service over status and seeks genuine humility as its defining attribute.

In a world that often glorifies the pursuit of power and personal gain, humility may appear out of place, even mistaken for weakness. Yet, this misunderstanding of humility diminishes its true value. Humility, at its core, is a virtue that beckons individuals to acknowledge their strengths and intrinsic worth while prioritizing the needs of others. It encourages a shift in focus from self to community, guiding leaders in various roles to act with humility.

A boss who values the well-being of their employees over personal recognition demonstrates humility. A parent who devotes time to their children displays humility. A politician who prioritizes the welfare of their constituents before electoral success is practicing humility. And when a priest or lay leader genuinely listens to the voices of their parishioners, they, too, embrace humility.

In light of these lessons, let us remember that our titles and positions should not inflate our egos but rather remind us of the specific responsibilities we hold in society. The mark of a true Christian, or a true leader, lies not in the number of servants they have but in the number of people they serve. By adopting this mindset, we can make humility a guiding principle in our lives and, in doing so, inspire others to follow the path of selfless service and genuine leadership.
