"Rejoice! Rejoice!"

Advent possesses a captivating blend of beauty and mystery, yet concurrently, an

ominous almost undertone. unsettling, Describing the Advent mood proves challenging; it often finds better expression in its somber hymns, resonating in minor keys. The scriptural lessons intensify this ambiance, persistently urging repentance, issuing dire warnings to "wait and watch," emphasizing the imperative preparation for what lies ahead. Stories abound of those caught off guard by God, analogous to tenants surprised by a longabsent landlord or bridesmaids anxiously awaiting the belated bridegroom.

In essence, Advent is a season of anticipation, primed with a nervous energy. However, the Third Sunday of Advent marks a significant shift. The foreboding lessons give way to a joyful dance. Suddenly, warnings transform into promises, with talk of deserts blossoming, seas exulting, and trees clapping hands. This Sunday, traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday, Latin for joy, becomes a day for celebration. Nevertheless, not everyone may feel like rejoicing. The prevailing mood might align more with the darker, anxious tones of the preceding Advent weeks, perhaps exacerbated by worldly concerns. The global news, often laden with sadness, anger, fear, and regret, echoes the unsettled nature of the season.

People come to church seeking a counter-narrative, burdened by daily struggles and larger societal worries. There's uncertainty about fate and future, and even the words heard in church may be questioned. The tension between the too-good-to-be-true nature of the Good News and the harsh realities of the world persists.

Despite this, the Third Sunday of Advent urges rejoicing. Placed strategically within the heavier Advent mood, it offers a major key of joy amid plaintive longing. The transition is evident in the Old Testament lesson, starting in the usual minor key but blossoming into a proclamation of joy and divine love in Chapter three.

The narrative from judgment to mercy, wrath to tender forgiveness, fear to rejoicing, and death to life reveals a consistent theme: the God who comes as a judge is the same God who becomes our Savior. This unity holds the waiting and rejoicing moods of Advent together. Christ, bearing our deserved sentence, turns away the enemy at the gates, offering a reprieve akin to a governor's pardon.

Rejoicing is not only on the part of humanity; even God celebrates. The Christian story, at its core, is a love story, depicting God's profound love for us. It is not merely about religion but centers on the God who heals, saves, gives meaning and hope, and transforms death into life. This is the God worth waiting, working, praying, and rejoicing for. As the community rejoices and sings, the hope extends to future generations, echoing the love of God in this sacred space for years to come.
