Oh Come Let us Adore Him



Here I am Lord!

Today's readings invite us to embark on a profound journey, tracing the steps of divine promises fulfilled in unexpected ways. The narrative

unfolds with the anticipation of the first coming of Jesus, establishing a timeless blueprint for His ongoing presence in our lives and the ultimate fulfillment at the end of time. Central to this unfolding drama is the pivotal role of Mary, underscoring her significance in the grand tapestry of our salvation.

In the tapestry of today's liturgy, the Davidic covenant emerges as a radiant thread, weaving through the First reading, Responsorial Psalm, and the Gospel. A promise resonates—the promise of an eternal throne, articulated by the angel Gabriel as he heralds the coming of Mary's son, destined to inherit the throne of David his father.

These sacred verses paint a vivid picture of God's promises to David, their fulfillment in the person of Jesus, the Son of David, and the remarkable surprises that characterize God's preparation for His arrival. The initial surprise in the First reading lies in God's response to David's wish to build a temple—a promise of an everlasting dynasty that surpasses anything David could have envisioned. The Responsorial Psalm further astonishes us by portraying God's covenant with David and his descendants, setting the stage for the unfolding divine drama.

The Gospel narrative takes us by surprise as well, revealing that the anticipated King is to be born of an ordinary virgin through the extraordinary means of the Holy Spirit. This divine plan, intricately involving Joseph, of the House of David, and Mary, underscores that God's promise finds its ultimate fulfillment not in grand edifices or mighty rulers but in humble, trusting souls like Mary.

The second reading, elucidated by Paul, deepens our understanding of God's salvation plan through Jesus, revealing that the divine design has unfolded through unexpected twists and turns throughout history.

Amidst these revelations, we are called to respond with a courageous and generous "yes" to God. True obedience, born of a free and informed choice, demands great courage, often requiring us to swim against the currents of societal expectations. This obedience transcends personal desires, aiming to serve something—or rather, Someone—greater than ourselves. In echoing the resounding "Fiat" of Jesus and Mary, we open the door for Jesus to be born anew within us, transforming not only ourselves but radiating outward to touch the lives of others.

Crucially, today's Good News extends beyond the collective salvation of God's people it unveils His intricate plan for each individual. Even in seemingly ordinary tasks, our actions align God's plan in ways beyond our comprehension. God seeks not just our skills but the profound love that emanates from our hearts. As we reflect on the Babe in the Manger, a symbol of God's ongoing benevolence, we are prompted to ask ourselves: What are we contributing in return?

Let our lives be a testament to gratitude, living as genuine disciples of Christ. As we echo the sentiment, "Behold, here I am, Lord! I come to do Your will," let our actions reverberate with the profound commitment to honor the divine plan and reciprocate the immeasurable love bestowed upon us.
