Empowering Lives: Embracing Divine Authority and Teaching with Conviction

Today's readings resonate with a powerful theme – the Divine authority exemplified by the prophets of the Old Testament, the apostles (including St. Paul) in the New Testament, and, notably, Jesus in his profound teaching and healing ministry. The first reading emphasizes that a true prophet speaks with authority because it is God who speaks through them. Post-Babylonian exile, the interpretation of Moses' words in the reading pointed to the anticipated Messiah, a prophecy validated in Jesus Christ according to Acts 3:22; 7:37. This passage is selected for today because it refers to Jesus, the "preacher with authority," as highlighted in the Gospel.

St. Paul, in the second reading, exercises his God-given authority to teach that marriage is a sacred union ordained by God, a lifelong partnership reflecting the teachings of the Lord. In the Gospel, Mark portrays a day in Jesus' public life, illustrating his participation in worship, healing, casting out evil spirits, and engaging in private prayer.

Approaching Jesus for liberation is an invitation to experience freedom. Unlike using authority for control, Jesus came to set people free. Let us trustingly approach Jesus, seeking liberation from inhibiting spirits that hinder prayer, love, and sharing blessings. Jesus is the source of abundant life, capable of freeing us from fear, selfishness, anger, and resentment. Through Word and Sacrament, Jesus empowers us, saying, "Be gone!" until we are entirely free from the demons that bind us.

Empowered by God-given authority, our role is to build up lives. Reflecting on impactful figures in our past, positive or negative, underscores the lasting influence individuals can have. Parents, teachers, and all of us play a pivotal role in shaping the lives

of the younger generation. We aspire not only for them to grow into capable adults but to witness and embrace Jesus' love through our actions. Teaching with authority and conviction allows God's love to shine through, leaving a profound impact on those around us.

Teachers, equipped with transformative authority, possess the ability to shape lives positively or negatively. Acknowledging Jesus as a teacher, we are reminded of the influential role teachers play in our lives. Let us strive to be good teachers, using our authority to guide and nurture young lives in the right direction. Just as Jesus was recognized as "Rabbi," let us embrace our roles as educators, leaving a lasting impact on those entrusted to our care.

Ash Wednesday, February 14th



Embarking on the season of Lent, we commence with Ash Wednesday on February 14th, a day that involves the symbolic marking of the
