The Beatitudes: A Call to True Happiness

There was once a farmer who lived a content and peaceful life, tending to his farm with the help of his loyal horse. One day, the horse ran away. Neighbors came to offer their sympathy. "What a misfortune," they said. The farmer simply replied, "Who knows? God knows." A week later, the horse returned, bringing with it another wild horse. The neighbors, overjoyed, congratulated him. "What a blessing," they exclaimed. Again, the farmer responded, "Who knows? God knows."

But then tragedy struck. While riding one of the horses, the farmer's son fell and broke his leg. Once again, the neighbors gathered around, offering their condolences. "What a tragedy," they said. And once again, the farmer replied, "Who knows? God knows." A week later, a war broke out, and the king ordered all able-bodied men to join the army. But because the farmer's son had a broken leg, he was spared from the draft. The neighbors, now in awe, came to share their joy. "What a blessing!" they exclaimed. The farmer's response remained the same: "Who knows? God knows."

This story beautifully illustrates the essence of the Beatitudes. It reminds us that true happiness is not found in wealth, power, or success, but in recognizing that we are children of a loving Heavenly Father. True happiness, or *beatitude*, is discovered when we embrace our blessings and share them with others, just as Jesus did during His earthly ministry.

The word "beatitude" translates to "blessedness," signifying both the enjoyment of God's favor and the experience of supreme happiness. In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah teaches that true happiness comes from placing our trust in God and His promises. The Responsorial Psalm reminds us that beatitude is found in keeping God's law, aligning our lives with His will. In the second reading, St. Paul assures us that true beatitude is found in Heaven, where Christ's Resurrection guarantees our eternal happiness.

In today's Gospel, Jesus flips conventional wisdom on its head by teaching His disciples about the paradoxical blessings found in poverty, hunger, sorrow, and persecution. He says, "Blessed are those who are poor, hungry, weeping, hated, excluded, insulted, and denounced," because in these challenges, we learn to depend on God, trust in His providence, seek reconciliation with Him, and find joy in standing firm for the faith, even in the face of adversity.

The Beatitudes are not just about enduring hardships for their own sake but living them in the context of our commitment to Jesus and His call to selfless love. They challenge us to live lives of humble selflessness, generously sharing our blessings with those in need. The Beatitudes must be understood as glimpses of future glory—promises that encourage us to live today in light of the joy that awaits us in eternity.

St. Teresa of Calcutta, a living example of the Beatitudes, once responded to a question about her work with the poor by saying, "Jesus says the poor are the blessed ones. I take Him at His word. I treat them as the royalty of God's kingdom, because they are." We, too, are called to live out the challenge of the Beatitudes in our daily lives. All around us, there are millions who are starving, persecuted, homeless, and in despair. The only way the promises of the Beatitudes can become a reality for them is through the love and action of people like us.

St. Teresa and the Missionaries of Charity have accepted this challenge, demonstrating that we can live the Beatitudes in the modern world. Every time we reach out to the needy, the sick, the oppressed, we offer them a taste of the promise of the Beatitudes here and now. Just as the apostles were called to minister to society's untouchables, so too are we called to serve the marginalized, the discriminated against, and the outcasts of our own time.
