Judge Not

There's a story of a wife who loved her husband deeply and desperately wanted to please him, despite his ever-criticism. Each morning, he seemed determined to find fault. If the eggs were scrambled, he longed for them poached; if they were poached, he wanted them scrambled. One day, with what she believed was a brilliant solution, the wife prepared one poached egg and one scrambled egg, hoping to satisfy him. As she eagerly placed the plate before him, she waited for praise. Instead, he scowled at the plate and grumbled, "Can't you do anything right? You scrambled the wrong one!"

In today's scripture, we are reminded of how our words and actions reflect the love we are called to share, and how our judgments can bring unnecessary harm. We are urged to speak with the same kindness and care that Jesus showed in His healing and teaching. Instead of gossiping or passing rash judgments that tarnish someone's reputation and inflict pain, we are called to uplift others with words that heal, restore, and bring hope. Jesus challenges us to consider our actions and words carefully—no longer allowing our careless judgments to cause harm. He vividly illustrates this point with examples, like a blind man trying to lead another blind man or a person with a log in their eye attempting to remove a speck from another's eye. These examples are not just humorous but also serve as powerful reminders that we must first look inward before judging others.

None of us, except God, is equipped to judge another person. Only He sees the full truth of our hearts and circumstances, and only He has the rightful authority to judge us. We see things only in part—we don't know the struggles, the pressures, or the unseen battles others are facing. It's all too easy to form conclusions based on partial views, and far too often, our judgments are clouded by our own flaws. We may even hold ourselves to a different standard than the one we apply to others, overlooking our own faults while magnifying theirs.

Consider the story of a crab walking along the shore, leaving behind its footprints in the sand. Proud of its trail, the crab admired its marks in the sand, only to watch them be washed away by the waves. In anger, the crab turned to the ocean and exclaimed, "Why would you do this? I thought you were my friend!" The ocean replied, "I washed away your footprints because a fisherman was following them, trying to catch you. It was my way of protecting you." Just like the crab, we often judge others based on what we see, without understanding the larger picture or the motivations behind their actions. We may criticize or misunderstand someone, but we must always pause to ask ourselves: what if we don't know the full story?

Today's Gospel calls us to examine our hearts. Are we contributing to joy and light in the world by uplifting and encouraging others, or are we adding to the burden of others by criticizing and tearing them down? If we find ourselves doing the latter, we must take to heart the words of Jesus. Our negative judgments don't just hurt others; they also destroy our own peace and joy. Let's strive to follow His example, showing compassion, understanding, and grace to all, as we walk this journey together.
