Luke 12: 13-21

True Wealth: A Heart Rich Toward God

In this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 12:13–21), Jesus offers us a powerful reminder that cuts to the heart of our modern lives: "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions."

A man in the crowd wants Jesus to settle a family inheritance dispute. Instead of dividing money, Jesus divides truth from illusion. He knows the real issue is not the inheritance, but the insatiable hunger for more that can take root in any heart.

To make His point, Jesus tells the parable of the rich fool—a man who is so successful that his barns cannot hold his harvest. So, he tears them down and builds bigger ones. He convinces himself he is finally secure: "Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry." But that very night, God calls him to account: "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?"

How often do we fall into the same trap? We work tirelessly to get more—more money, more comfort, more security, more recognition. We build "bigger barns" in the form of bank accounts, investments, homes, and things we believe will make us safe and happy. But Jesus reminds us that all of this can disappear in an instant.

We do need to plan wisely and provide for our families—Jesus does not condemn responsible stewardship. But He warns us that when we put our ultimate trust in possessions, we lose sight of what really matters: being rich toward God.

What does it mean to be rich toward God? It means recognizing that everything we have is a gift and that we are stewards, not owners. It means using what we have to bless others, to build up the Kingdom, to care for the poor, the lonely, and the forgotten. It means placing our security not in full barns, but in the faithful love of a God who never fails.

This week, the Gospel invites us to examine our hearts honestly: Am I so focused on protecting what I have that I forget to share with those in need? Do I cling to possessions as my source of peace instead of relying on God? Where can I be more generous—with my time, my resources, my attention? Perhaps it is time to build bigger barns of compassion, mercy, and love. Perhaps it is time to tear down the walls of self-centered security and make room for God's abundance to flow through us.

In the end, the only treasures that endure are those stored up in heaven: the kindness we show, the burdens we help carry, the hungry we feed, the lonely we visit, the prayers we offer, the forgiveness we extend. May this parable shake us awake, not with fear but with hope—hope that true wealth is always within reach. It is found not in what we store up for ourselves, but in what we pour out for God and one another. "So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God." May we be counted among the truly rich—those whose hearts are open, hands are generous, and souls find their rest in the love that never ends.

Let us pray for the grace to live simply, give generously, and trust fully—so that when our lives are demanded of us, we will have stored up the only treasure that truly matters.
