CAST YOUR NET ON THE OTHER SIDE

The scene unfolds on the Sea of Tiberias, where the disciples, weary and heavy-hearted, have returned to their old way of life after the tragic and world-shattering events surrounding the death of Jesus. They've gone back to what they knew best: fishing. Despite their expertise and years of experience, they spent the entire night on the water with nothing to show for it. As the morning light breaks, they begin to head back to shore, discouraged, but then a voice calls out from the shore, asking, "Have you caught any fish?" Shame fills their hearts as they answer, "No." They've tried everything and failed. But the voice calls again, "Throw your net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." It seems foolish—after all, they've been fishing all night and nothing has worked. What possible difference could it make to throw their nets on the other side of the boat? They're seasoned fishermen, and this stranger doesn't seem to know anything about fishing. But for reasons they can't explain, they follow the voice's advice and cast their nets on the other side. Suddenly, their nets fill with fish to the point they can't even pull them in. Astonished, it dawns on them who the voice belongs to. "It is the Lord!" says the disciple whom Jesus loved.

There are powerful lessons to be learned from this story, lessons that speak deeply to our lives today.

Obeying Jesus Opens the Door to Blessings

The first lesson is this: obedience to Jesus can unlock blessings we never imagined. Sometimes, we find ourselves in situations where it feels like we've hit a wall. We've tried everything we know to do, and nothing is working. We've been here before, so we think we know what to do. But then, someone—or in this case, Jesus—suggests something so simple, even foolish. A small action that seems so counterintuitive. "Cast your net on the right side," Jesus tells them. Could such a simple change really make a difference? It may sound illogical, even frustrating. But here's the truth: obedience to Jesus, even when it seems silly or inconvenient, opens the door to miracles. Blessings follow when we listen to Him, even when we think we know better. In our relationship with God, success and fulfillment don't come from our own strength or wisdom, but from obeying His voice. We can't keep doing the same thing over and over and expect different results. But when we listen to Jesus, even in the simplest of commands, that's when we start to see things change.

God Shows Up When We Are at the End of Ourselves.

The second lesson is this: God often meets us at the end of our own resources. The disciples had tried everything they knew—spent the whole night, used their skills and knowledge, yet they were empty-handed. They were at the end of their ability, and that's when Jesus appeared. It is often at the moment we are exhausted, when we've given all we can, that God shows up with the breakthrough we need.

There's a lesson in that. Our weaknesses and limitations aren't something to be ashamed of. They are often the very thing that leads us to God's strength. When we finally reach the end of our efforts, when we stop trying to control everything, that's when God can truly take over. When we relinquish control, stop striving for personal success, and surrender to God's plan, that's when things begin to happen in ways we couldn't have imagined. The end of us is the beginning of God.

The Answer Is Closer Than We Think

The third lesson is that sometimes the answer we're looking for is closer than we think. The disciples were fishing all night, casting their nets in the same spot, yet all they had to do was move the nets to the other side of the boat. The solution was right there, but it required faith and obedience to act.

The lesson here is profound: often, the answer is within reach, but it requires us to obey God in small ways. We're not called to do grandiose, attention-grabbing things, but to be faithful in the simple, everyday acts of obedience. As Eugene Peterson puts it, it's about "a long obedience in the same direction." It's about listening to God, following His guidance, and doing the little things that bring us closer to the blessings He has for us.

So, when life feels frustrating, when the answers aren't coming, and when we feel like we've reached the end of our resources, remember this story. Trust that God's guidance is always available, even when it seems counterintuitive. Throw your net on the other side. Your breakthrough may be just a simple step of obedience away.




Congratulations to the Children who will be receiving their First Holy Communion at Our Lady of Peace Parish this weekend and next. May 3rd, 4th & 11th.
