“Behold the Lamb of God”

Today’s readings invite us to fix our eyes on Jesus, whom John the Baptist boldly identifies as “the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.” This simple yet profound title opens before us the heart of our Christian faith and challenges us not only to believe, but to live and witness as disciples of the Lamb.

John the Baptist is a powerful model for us. He does not draw attention to himself, despite his popularity and influence. Instead, with humility and clarity, he points away from himself and toward Jesus. His mission is not self-promotion, but faithful witness. In doing so, John teaches us that true discipleship always involves helping others recognize Christ and follow Him.

The image of the Lamb would have been rich with meaning for John’s listeners. It recalled the lamb of sacrifice, the Passover lamb whose blood saved God’s people, and the suffering servant spoken of by the prophets. When John calls Jesus the Lamb of God, he is proclaiming that Jesus is the one who will take upon Himself the sin, brokenness, and suffering of the world—not through power or violence, but through love, obedience, and self-giving sacrifice.

The first reading from Isaiah reminds us that God’s call is personal and purposeful. The servant is called from the womb and sent not only to restore Israel, but to be “a light to the nations.” This mission finds its fulfillment in Jesus, but it does not end with Him. Through our Baptism, we share in this same calling. We are chosen, formed, and sent—to reflect Christ’s light in our families, workplaces, parish, and society.

Saint Paul, writing to the Corinthians, reinforces this truth. He reminds them—and us—that we are “sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be holy.” Holiness is not reserved for a few; it is the vocation of every baptized person. Together, as members of the Body of Christ, we are called to live lives shaped by faith, love, and service.

The Gospel shows us how discipleship begins and grows. Andrew and John first respond to Jesus’ gentle invitation: “Come and see.” They spend time with Him, listen to Him, and gradually come to recognize who He truly is. Faith, we are reminded, is often discovered not in dramatic moments, but in simple encounters—by staying close to Jesus and allowing Him to reveal Himself.

Andrew’s response is especially practical and inspiring. Having encountered Christ, he immediately brings someone else—his brother Simon—to Jesus. This is how the Church grows: one invitation at a time. Andrew does not argue or preach; he simply shares what he has found. His example challenges us to ask ourselves: whom have I invited to “come and see”?

To follow the Lamb of God also means to live like the Lamb. This calls us to humility, gentleness, and compassion in a world that often values power and self-interest. It means striving to live pure and sincere lives, trusting in the care of the Good Shepherd, and drawing strength from prayer, the Sacraments, and especially the Eucharist, where Christ the Lamb feeds us with His own Body and Blood.

But living like the Lamb also means learning how to sacrifice. We are called to share our blessings, to stand with those who suffer, and to offer our struggles—big and small—for the good of others. In doing so, we participate in Christ’s work of healing and reconciliation, helping to rebuild broken lives and restore hope.

Finally, today’s Gospel reminds us that disciples are witnesses. Faith is not something to be kept private or at a distance. To know Christ is to love Him, and to love Him is to desire that others may know Him too. Our witness is expressed not only in words, but in lives marked by kindness, justice, mercy, forgiveness, and peace.

As we reflect on today’s readings, let us hear again John the Baptist’s words as spoken directly to us: “Behold, the Lamb of God.” May we recognize Him, follow Him closely, live as He lived, and invite others—by our words and our lives—to come and see.

Pastoral Letters of Reference

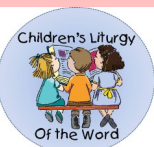
