## The Epiphany of Our Lord

On this Feast of the Epiphany, the Word of God proclaims a powerful and hope-filled message: God's light has appeared, and it is meant for all. Isaiah cries out across the centuries, "Arise, shine, for your light has come!" These are not just poetic words for ancient Israel—they are a summons to us, here and now.

Isaiah speaks to a people living in darkness, uncertainty, and fear. Yet into that darkness, God promises light—His own glory rising like the dawn. This is not a private light meant for a few, but a light so radiant that nations are drawn to it, kings are guided by it, and hearts are set aflame with joy. The prophet's vision reaches its fulfillment in today's Gospel, where wise men from distant lands follow a star to Bethlehem.

The Magi represent the whole human family—seekers, outsiders, people from other cultures and traditions—who are drawn by God's light even when they do not yet know His name. They remind us that God is always ahead of us, guiding us gently, patiently, faithfully. While Herod is troubled and threatened by the newborn King, the Magi rejoice. Fear closes hearts; wonder opens them. The same Child who unsettles the powerful fills the humble with joy.

Saint Paul, in his letter to the Ephesians, names this truth clearly: the great mystery has now been revealed—in Christ, there are no outsiders. Gentiles and Jews, men and women, rich and poor, strong and weak are all fellow heirs, members of one body, sharers in the same promise. The Epiphany is not only about Christ being revealed to the nations; it is about God revealing His dream for humanity: unity, dignity, and shared hope.

Psalms 72 gives us a picture of what life looks like when we truly allow Christ to reign. Justice flourishes. Peace abounds. The poor are defended. The needy are heard. This is not a distant fantasy; it is a mission entrusted to us. If Christ is King, then His values must shape our choices, our relationships, and our priorities.

The Magi teach us something deeply practical. They set out, they pay attention to the signs, they offer their best, and they return home by another road. Encountering Christ always changes us. Faith is not just about kneeling in adoration; it is about walking differently afterward—choosing compassion over comfort, courage over fear, generosity over indifference.

This week, the Epiphany invites us to ask: Where is God's light trying to break into my life? Whom is God calling me to welcome, include, or serve? What gift am I being asked to place before the Lord?

In a world still covered by darkness—violence, division, loneliness, and despair—we are called not to curse the darkness, but to shine. Our parish, our families, our workplaces can become places of Epiphany when we reflect Christ's light through kindness, justice, forgiveness, and hope.

Arise. Shine. The light has come—and through you, God wants that light to reach others.

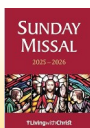


### 2026 OFFERTORY ENVELOPES
