EMMANUEL — GOD WITH US

At the very heart of Christmas is not sentiment or nostalgia, but a staggering truth: God has chosen to be with us. Not from a distance. Not conditionally. But fully, vulnerably, and forever. Emmanuel—God with us—is God’s answer to our fear, our sin, and our loneliness.

Over a hundred years ago, St. Damien of Molokai, a Belgian priest, lived among people with leprosy on a remote Hawaiian island. He built water systems, clinics, sanitation, and a chapel. Every Sunday, he began his homily with the same words: “You lepers know that God loves you.” Years later, after he himself contracted leprosy, he began one homily differently: “We lepers know that God loves us.” Damien had not merely served the suffering—he had become one with them. That is Emmanuel. That is Christmas.

In an infinitely deeper way, Jesus has done the same for us. He did not save us from a safe distance. He entered our human weakness, bore our wounds, carried our sin, and healed us by His love. “He was bruised and wounded for our sins... and by His stripes we were healed.”

When the prophet Isaiah spoke to King Ahaz, the king was afraid, calculating, and relying on political alliances instead of God. Ahaz refused to trust. Yet God gave a sign anyway: “Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be Emmanuel.” A child. Vulnerable. Small. Seemingly powerless. As the poet Carl Sandburg once said, “A baby is God’s opinion that the world should go on.” Christmas proclaims that no matter how dark the times, God has not given up on us. Seven centuries later, Matthew’s Gospel declares the final fulfillment of that promise. Jesus is not only descended from David—He is God-with-us, conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary. God does not abandon His people. He enters their story.

Matthew draws our attention to St. Joseph, a quiet, faithful man placed in an impossible situation. Discovering Mary’s pregnancy, Joseph could have acted out of fear, anger, or strict legalism. Instead, he chose mercy. And when God spoke to him in a dream, Joseph obeyed—promptly, silently, completely. Joseph trusted when Ahaz did not. Joseph relied on God, not on schemes. Joseph teaches us that righteousness is not loud or dramatic—it is faithful obedience. How often are we tempted, like Ahaz, to live as though God is not really with us? Christmas reminds us that even in uncertainty, God is present and at work.

There is a story of a little boy who wanted to buy a crippled puppy that a shop owner considered worthless. When told the dog would be put to sleep, the boy lifted his pant legs, revealing his own braces, and said, “Mister, you don’t know what love can do.” That is the Gospel. Jesus has worn our braces. He has carried our weakness. He has died our death—so that we might live.

Four days before Christmas, we are here because we trust—despite financial stress, family struggles, health concerns, and uncertainty. Like Joseph, let us listen to God in prayer and Scripture, and rely not on our own plans but on His mercy.

Let Emmanuel change us—and the world. If God is with us, why so much brokenness? Because God waits for entry. Christ still longs to enter our hearts, to transform bitterness into mercy, fear into compassion, and indifference into love.

What gift do we give Jesus this Christmas? More than anything else, He desires a heart filled with love, mercy, forgiveness, and compassion. That is what we need most—and what God longs to give.


